Curriculum Overview:

In the Classroom: Fifth grade comprises of seven basic subjects: Grammar; Writing/Composition; Literature; Math; History; Science; and Latin. These subjects will be taught weekly. The approximate schedules, excluding Latin, are given on the following pages. The Latin schedule will be provided by Mrs. Flanagan.

At Home:

Read alouds, Memorization and Homework: Veritas parents are expected to assist their fifth grader with homework and memorization assignments and read to him/her. Students will be tested on the memorization assignments in class.

Home Chapel: Daily 'Home Chapel' is an important part of a Veritas education. A suggested Bible reading schedule, hymn and psalm of the month, and scripture and catechism memorization are given on the Home Chapel Schedule.

Subject Syllabi:

Literature - Fifth graders will read four novels, approximately one per quarter. As we study each unit, we will learn new vocabulary; develop comprehension skills; and review literary elements such as setting, plot, characters, and theme. Students will also increase in comparing and contrasting, evaluating, classifying, categorizing, listening, speaking, and analyzing skills. The four novels covered are: *The Golden Goblet* by Eloise Jarvis McGraw, *Phantom Tollbooth* by Norton Juster, *Adam of the Road* by Elizabeth Janet Gray, and *From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler* by E. L. Konigsburg.

Grammar - *Shurley Grammar, Level 6*, Units 1 – 5 is used for grammar. Students are taught the basic parts of speech using jingles and written sentence examples. In fifth grade, these include the noun, verb, adverb, adjective, preposition, object of the preposition, the helping verbs, direct and indirect objects, predicate nominative, and predicate adjective. Students are taught five patterns of sentences. For Spelling we will be using the *Wise Guide (of SWR)* lists T - Z.

Composition: Fifth graders will study composition from *Warriner's English Grammar and Composition*, Chapters 15-21 as well as two other texts by Matt Whitling (*Imitation in Writing: Greek Myths*, and *Imitation in Writing: Medieval Legends*) that follow the Excellence In Writing model which Veritas uses to teach composition in the lower grades. Students will focus on the structure and development of a paragraph; kinds of paragraphs; compositions that inform; reports and compositions of opinion; story outlines and writing stories; social and business letters.

Math - Fifth grade will study math from *Saxon Math 76*. Saxon teaches the foundational skills of mathematics using an incremental approach, one that introduces new concepts in small increments and distributes those across the year so that no concepts or skills are lost. Students are given daily practice that reinforces old skills as well as new ones. We will begin the year with the basics of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division, and will end by studying ratios and proportions as well as basic geometry. Please note that student performance will affect our pacing in the math text. When necessary, review lessons will be inserted into the schedule outlined below.

History - Fifth graders will be studying the first half of World History this year. Beginning with the earliest civilizations in Mesopotamia, this class gives an overview of the first 5,000 years of Western Civilization, ending with the Protestant Reformation. Students will learn about the Ancient World which encompasses the civilizations of the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans; the Middle Ages; the Renaissance; and the Reformation. Students will see the growth and development of Western Civilization as well as the place of the Christian church in its formation.

In addition to read-alouds and readers, the students will be reading four textbooks which will be discussed in class: *Story of the World Vol. I: Ancient Times*, *Augustus Caesar's World*, *Story of the World Vol. II: Middle Ages*, and *The World of Columbus and Sons*. It will be a wonderful year studying biblical history from a biblical perspective.
